### **PROGRAM GOAL:**

The goal of this program is to provide participants with an update on the latest literature in human trafficking, molecular oncology, resistant gram-negative infections, and management of type 2 diabetes.

#### **PROGRAM OBJECTIVES:**

At the conclusion of this knowledge-based activity, the participant will be able to:

- Understand the types and venues of human trafficking.
   Identify the warning signs of potential victims of human trafficking. Review resources for reporting suspected victims of human trafficking.
- 2. Review the molecular basis of cancer and types of molecular testing. Discuss the successes of targeted drug therapy and the future of molecular oncology and precision medicine.
- 3. Discuss resistant gram-negative infections and identify high-risk populations. Summarize antibiotic treatments, including the newer therapeutic agents.
- 4. Provide an overview on the epidemiology and diagnosis of Type 2 DM. Review glycemic control, monitoring, and lifestyle modification. Summarize initial pharmacotherapy and management of persistent hyperglycemia.

This educational program is intended for physicians, physician assistants, dentists, pharmacists, pharmacy technicians, nurse practitioners and nurses.
